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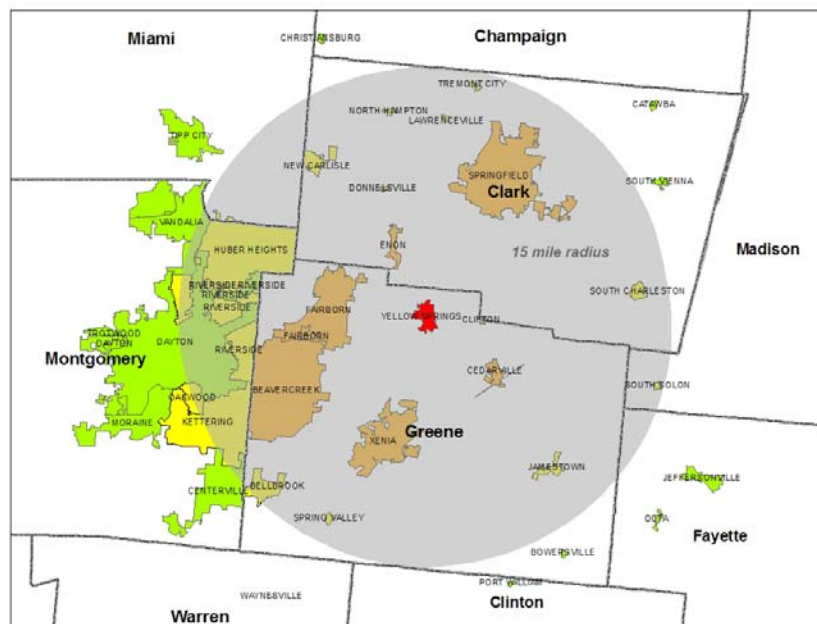
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Chapter I: Introduction

The Community Information Project, a coalition of Yellow Springs leaders, has embarked on a process of gathering citizen input to make decisions about their Village¹. Part of this data collection effort involved gathering feedback from individuals living outside of the Village to see what these individuals think of Yellow Springs. With this in mind, the Community Information Project Advisory Committee of The Yellow Springs Men's Group partnered with Wright State University's Center for Urban and Public Affairs (CUPA) to conduct a survey of Miami Valley residents about their choices for housing, shopping, recreation, and jobs.

This survey provided all residents living within a 15-mile radius of Yellow Springs¹ an equal opportunity to voice their opinions and views regarding their choices for housing, recreation, shopping and jobs. Analysis of these responses will help to identify areas of success and concern for Yellow Springs that should be taken into consideration when making decisions about how to best promote the Village. A 15-mile radius was selected because researchers hypothesized that individuals living within this radius should have some knowledge of Yellow Springs and the comparison communities selected for this study. Including individuals from a wider radius might have led to individuals having no knowledge of some of the communities being discussed. A map of the survey target area is shown below.



¹ The terms Yellow Springs and Village throughout the report are intended to include both the Village of Yellow Springs and the surrounding Miami Township.

The following paragraphs will further explain the objectives of the survey, provide an overview of the report, and discuss the methodology and limitations of the survey.

Objectives

The main objective of this survey is to assess whether residents of nearby communities would choose Yellow Springs as a community in which to live, work, learn and visit for shopping and/or recreation.

Methodology

Questionnaire Design

The survey instrument was designed by Wright State University's Center for Urban and Public Affairs, in conjunction with the Community Information Project Advisory Committee. The survey was finalized with the approval of the Community Information Project Advisory Committee. CUPA wishes to extend sincere appreciation to Fred Bartenstein for his assistance in identifying peer communities to Yellow Springs for use on survey questions.

Sampling Design

This study was a random digit dialed (RDD) telephone survey of residents living in a 15-mile radius around Yellow Springs. In an RDD study, any household with standard telephone service has an equal opportunity to be interviewed. Therefore, since each household has an equal chance of being selected, results from the survey generally represent the opinions of the community as a whole. Because RDD includes both listed and unlisted telephone numbers, random digit dialing is preferred over other sampling methods. A sample of random digit dial telephone numbers was purchased from Genesys, a national company that generates telephone numbers.

Survey Implementation

Interviews were conducted from Tuesday, June 14, 2005 through Sunday, July 10, 2005, usually between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Interviewers utilized a Computer Aided Telephone Interviewing (CATI) software program that displays the questionnaire on a computer screen and allows the interviewers to enter the response directly into the computer. Such a system helps to minimize errors in gathering data.

A total of 534 respondents were interviewed to obtain a 95 percent confidence and a plus or minus 4.8 percent sampling error for the region as a whole. A quota sampling method was used to ensure that demographics of survey respondents are close to the demographics of the population in general.

Data Analysis

Primarily, we use descriptive statistics to analyze and interpret the survey findings. To measure the statistical differences among responses, a chi-square test is used to compare, for example, the differences between responses from one age group to another age group. Statistically significant differences among demographics, where applicable, are discussed throughout the report.

Limitations

The survey has several limitations. As with every telephone survey, the primary limitation is that it excludes households that do not have land line telephones. It is estimated that about five percent of households nationally do not have telephones. These households are more likely to be poor, or to be younger individuals who have abandoned the land-line telephone for a cell phone. A second limitation of the study is that it is based on self-reported information. Attempts were made to include more than one question on important topics to test for internal consistency.

Chapter 2: Demographics

Sample demographics are presented to provide a snapshot of survey respondents and a context in which to interpret the findings of the survey. The following demographic characteristics were obtained from the survey: age, race, income, political affiliation, city or township of residence and gender.

As mentioned previously, individuals living in jurisdictions within a 15-mile radius of Yellow Springs were eligible to participate in the survey. Demographics were tabulated for individuals living in these jurisdictions so that a quota sampling method could be used that would allow researchers to ensure that sample demographics match the actual population as closely as possible. A table is presented below showing the age ranges of individuals in the sample compared to actual Census data.

The largest number of survey respondents came from Dayton (94) and Springfield (92), followed by Beavercreek (64), Huber Heights (50), Fairborn, (44) and Xenia (40). A complete list of how many respondents came from each jurisdiction is found in Appendix C.

Consistent with the gender demographics of the survey area, more than half (57.9 percent) of respondents are female, while the remaining 42.1 percent are male.

Almost half of respondents have a household income between \$20,000 and \$60,000 a year. A complete distribution of responses is provided in the table below.

More than one-third of respondents (36.5 percent) categorize themselves politically as middle of the road. Of the remaining respondents, 45.1 percent are conservative and 18.4 percent are liberal.

More than 86 percent of respondents (86.5 percent) are Caucasian/white, 7.0 percent are African-American/black, and the remaining 6.5 percent are some other race.

Chapter 3: Yellow Springs External Perception

Survey respondents were asked a series of questions about Miami Valley communities in order to assess how each community compares in relation to another on a range of topics. The primary purpose was to determine how well Yellow Springs is recognized regionally in comparison to each of the other jurisdictions, as well as to explore why respondents would choose other communities instead of Yellow Springs to live, work, learn and visit for shopping and/or recreation.

In the introduction to the survey, respondents were told that the survey was being conducted to assess perceptions of Miami Valley communities. In an attempt to not bias the data, respondents were not told that the interviewer was calling on behalf of the Community Information Project or any party connected to the Village.

On each survey question, respondents were provided with four communities from which to choose about a given topic, and Yellow Springs was included in each list. Therefore, while respondents were not directly told that they were being contacted on behalf of Yellow Springs, one could assume that respondents may have reached that conclusion by the end of the survey. It should be noted; however, that no respondents communicated this to survey interviewers during the course of the interview.

Satisfaction with the Miami Valley

Before asking community specific questions, respondents were asked a series of questions about the Miami Valley as a whole. These questions were asked to determine a baseline for satisfaction on the series of issues that would be discussed later.

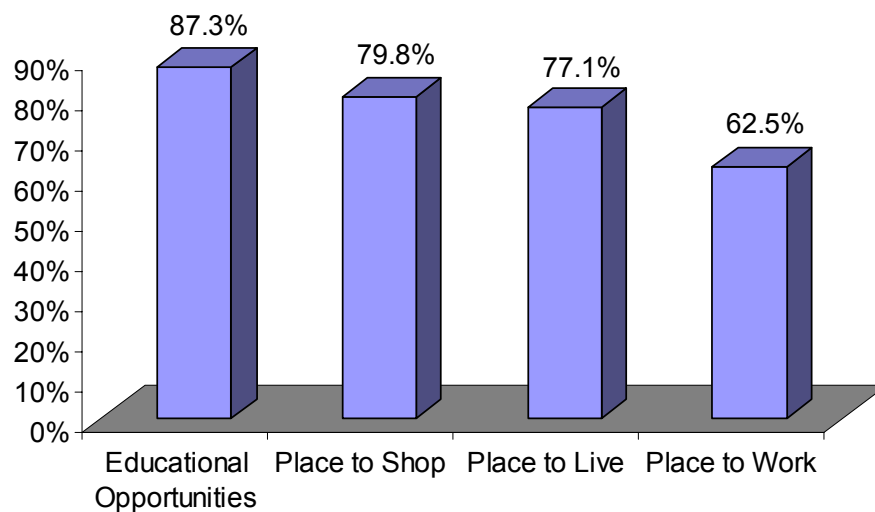
When asked to rate the Miami Valley as a place to live, more than three-quarters of respondents indicated that it is an excellent or good place to live, with 16.9 percent saying excellent and 60.2 percent saying good. Another 19.7 percent rated the Miami Valley as a fair place to live, while 3.2 percent said poor.

Respondents were more supportive when discussing the Miami Valley as a place that offers educational opportunities for people of all ages. Almost ninety percent (87.3 percent) of Miami Valley residents surveyed stated that the Miami Valley is excellent (36.9 percent) or good (50.5 percent) at offering educational opportunities for people of all ages. Another 10.8 percent described the Miami Valley as fair, while just 1.9 percent indicated that the Miami Valley is poor at offering educational opportunities for people of all ages.

Respondents were also supportive of the Miami Valley as a place to shop. Almost eighty percent (79.8 percent) rated the Miami Valley as an excellent or good place to shop, with 22.5 percent saying excellent and 57.3 percent saying good. Another 18.0 percent rated the Miami Valley as a fair place to shop, while 2.2 percent said it was poor.

Respondents were less positive when discussing the Miami Valley as a place to work. Less than two-thirds of respondents (62.5 percent) identified the Miami Valley as an excellent or good place to work, with 13.6 percent saying excellent and 48.9 percent saying good. Another 30.3 percent said that the Miami Valley is a fair place to work, while the remaining 7.3 percent said poor.

Important Attributes when Purchasing a Home

The next section of the survey dealt with attributes that are important to residents when choosing where to purchase a home.

First, respondents were asked if they anticipate moving in the next five years. Almost one-third (32.4 percent) of survey respondents do anticipate moving in the next five years. As might be expected, younger respondents are statistically more likely than older respondents to indicate that they anticipate moving over the next five years. Specifically, 56.0 percent of 18-24 year old respondents and 53.7 percent of 25-34 year old respondents indicate that they anticipate moving in the next five years. This decreases to 25.4 percent of 55-64 year old respondents and 10.1 percent of respondents 65 and older.

Next, respondents were read a list of attributes and were asked to state whether they believe each attribute is very important, important, unimportant or very unimportant when

choosing where to buy a home. The list of attributes included quality of schools, quality of housing, job opportunities, price of housing, access to parks, green space and recreation, and shopping opportunities.

More than eighty percent of respondents identified each of these attributes as very important or important when choosing to purchase a home. In fact, almost all respondents believe that quality of housing (98.9 percent) and price of housing (98.3 percent) are very important or important when choosing where to move.

Given the fact that most respondents believe that each attribute is important, further research was done to explore which attributes are considered very important by respondents. When exploring the respondents who identified attributes as very important, more than fifty percent of respondents selected job opportunities (58.8 percent), quality of housing (55.5 percent), price of housing (53.7 percent) and quality of schools (51.8 percent). Fewer respondents identified access to parks, green space and recreation (27.5 percent) and shopping opportunities (17.9 percent). Therefore, while all of these attributes are considered important to some degree by most respondents, they are not as important as more tangible elements such as job opportunities, housing price and quality, or the quality of schools.

As one would expect, crosstabs run by respondent demographics identified several statistically significant differences. On all questions, female respondents were significantly more likely than male respondents to identify each attribute as very important. However, collapsing the data further into "Important" versus "Not Important" revealed very little variation between men and women.

Younger respondents were significantly more likely than older respondents to identify quality of schools and job opportunities as very important. Specifically, 70.3 percent of respondents 25-34 said that quality of schools is very important to where they choose to live compared to just 35.8 percent of respondents 55 and older. Additionally, female respondents (58.1 percent) were significantly more likely than male respondents (43.0 percent) to say that quality of schools are very important to their choice of where to live.

Almost three-quarters (73.1 percent) of respondents between the ages of 18 and 34 identified job opportunities as a very important attribute for choosing where to live. This decreased to 42.8 percent for respondents 55 and older. This difference is statistically significant.

Older respondents were more likely to identify shopping opportunities as an important factor to where they choose to buy a home. Almost one-quarter (24.9 percent) of respondents 55 and older believe that proximity to shopping opportunities is an important factor when purchasing a home. This percentage shrinks to 10.5 percent for respondents between the ages of 25 and 44. Other variables, such as quality of housing and price of housing did not see significant differences among demographic groups.

Community Specific Questions

Next, respondents were asked a series of questions in which they were asked to select one of four Miami Valley communities that they believe is the best in a particular topic, such as recreation, shopping, schools, and so on. After each question, respondents were asked to identify why they chose a given community. As mentioned previously, Yellow Springs was listed as an option for each question, allowing researchers to identify areas where Miami Valley residents view Yellow Springs as strong in relation to other communities. Attempts were made to select communities that were likely competitors for Yellow Springs in offering these selected services.

A larger than expected percentage of respondents indicated that they did not know anything about any of the communities given as choices. Respondents from Springfield made up almost half of all survey respondents who answered "Don't Know" to three or more of the following five questions. This shows that most Miami Valley communities, even those touted as exceptional in various areas, do not have a tremendous amount of draw outside Montgomery and Greene Counties.

Educational Opportunities

First, respondents were asked to select between Beavercreek, Centerville, Oakwood and Yellow Springs as a community that offers educational opportunities for people of all ages. While Yellow Springs is the only community listed that actually contains a university (Wright State University is actually in Fairborn, though was considered in Beavercreek by many respondents), the fewest number of respondents selected Yellow Springs as a community with excellent educational opportunities.

Almost half of individuals surveyed (46.6 percent) selected Beavercreek as the community they would recommend to a friend or neighbor to move to as a place with excellent educational opportunities. Another 26.5 percent selected Centerville, while 15.5 percent said Oakwood and 11.4 percent said Yellow Springs.

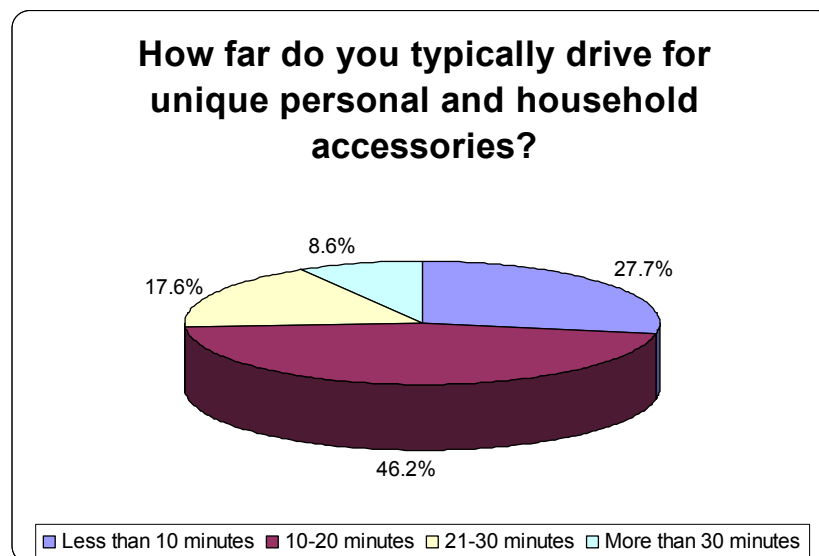
When asked why they had chosen Beavercreek as the community with excellent education opportunities, many respondents discussed Beavercreek's proximity to higher education, such as Wright State, the University of Dayton, and Central State University. Experience with the school district as well as school district ratings also influenced why respondents selected Beavercreek. Centerville and Oakwood also received votes due to the school district perception and test scores that have been achieved.

Respondents choosing Yellow Springs discussed the diversity of the school district and the fact that the district is not "snobby," unlike the other three choices. Less than ten respondents mentioned Antioch University when they mentioned Yellow Springs, showing that the College and Antioch McGregor is not playing a major role in Yellow Springs' educational image in the region.

A crosstab run on this question by distance from Yellow Springs shows that individuals living within ten miles of the village are twice as likely to select Yellow Springs as a place with excellent educational opportunities than those living outside a ten-mile radius. This shows that the community may need to market themselves outside of Greene County, as survey data shows that many residents living outside the County are unfamiliar with all aspects of education in the Village.

Shopping Opportunities

Before selecting a community that residents believe is an excellent place to shop, respondents were asked how far they typically travel to shop for unique personal and household accessories, clothing, specialty food items and gifts. Almost half of respondents (46.2 percent) indicated that they travel 10-20 minutes to shop for these items. A complete distribution of responses is provided in the figure below.



When asked to identify a community that had unique shopping opportunities, more than two-thirds of respondents (67.8 percent) selected Beavercreek. Another 16.6 percent selected Yellow Springs, while 13.0 percent said Centerville and 2.6 percent said Bellbrook.

Almost all respondents selecting Beavercreek as the community with unique shopping opportunities discussed the Fairfield Commons Mall and the variety of stores that are available in and around the mall. Other respondents discussed Beavercreek's centralized location and easy access to other communities. Respondents selecting Yellow Springs as the community with unique shopping opportunities discussed the Village's quaint shops and the absence of major retail stores.

Unlike education, distance from Yellow Springs did not have a significant impact on whether respondents would choose to shop there. Other demographic variables, such as age and political affiliation were significant factors in whether respondents would shop in Yellow Springs.

Younger respondents, those under the age of 35, were much more likely to select Yellow Springs as an excellent community in which to shop. Specifically, 23.8 percent of respondents under the age of 35 selected Yellow Springs as the community with unique shopping opportunities. Just 15.7 percent of respondents age 55 to 64 selected Yellow Springs, while the percentage fell to 8.2 percent of respondents 65 and older.

While political affiliation emerged as a significant variable, the difference may not be as great as some might expect. More than one-quarter (25.6 percent) of those classifying themselves as liberal selected Yellow Springs as the community with unique shopping opportunities. This percentage dropped to 19.2 percent of respondents classifying themselves as "middle of the road" and 12.0 percent of those classifying themselves as conservative.

Recreation Opportunities

Yellow Springs fared extremely well when respondents were asked to identify the community that has excellent recreation opportunities. When given the option between Yellow Springs, Bellbrook, Englewood and Germantown, almost half of all respondents (43.7 percent) selected Yellow Springs. Another 32.1 percent of respondents selected Bellbrook, while 18.1 percent said Englewood and 6.0 percent said Germantown.

When asked why they selected Yellow Springs as the community with excellent recreation opportunities, respondents discussed Young's Jersey Dairy, John Bryan State Park and Glen Helen, along with the bike paths that connect the Village to surrounding communities.

Housing Opportunities

When asked to identify communities that would be an excellent place to purchase a home, Yellow Springs did not fare well. More than half of respondents (50.1 percent) selected Beavercreek as a community they would recommend to a friend or neighbor. Another 20.0 percent selected Bellbrook, while 18.7 percent said Centerville, and 11.2 percent said Yellow Springs.

Respondents who selected Beavercreek discussed the vast availability of different types of housing that are available in Beavercreek. Surprisingly, several respondents indicated that they would like to live in Beavercreek because the City is close to Yellow Springs, but these same respondents would not choose to live in Yellow Springs.

Respondents selecting Yellow Springs spoke of the Village as a small, quiet, laid back community that was away from the congestion of the surrounding metropolitan area. However, many respondents who did not choose Yellow Springs spoke of a lack of available housing and high housing prices in comparison to communities elsewhere.

Job Opportunities

Finally, respondents were asked to select a community that would be an excellent place to work. Communities provided as options included Beavercreek, Centerville, Fairborn and Yellow Springs. The highest percentage of respondents (42.5 percent) selected Beavercreek. Another 32.2 percent selected Centerville, while 21.3 percent said Fairborn, and just 4.0 percent said Yellow Springs.

This small percentage is concerning in that job opportunities were rated as a very important factor by almost all respondents under the age of 35. While this group of respondents is likely to choose Yellow Springs as a place to shop and recreate, the perceived lack of available jobs may prohibit the Village from attracting these individuals as residents.

Respondents selecting Beavercreek and Fairborn discussed the abundance of jobs available in the area, as well as proximity to downtown Dayton and Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. A potential option for the Village is to promote their proximity to these locations as well, while still promoting the unique qualities found in the Village, but not found in these other communities.

Chapter 4: Conclusion

Survey results show that there are several areas that Yellow Springs can capitalize on in order to bring individuals and money into the community. One might assume that the best way to eventually attract individuals to live in a community is to get these individuals into the community for another reason. It appears that Yellow Springs is faring well in doing this, as the community received positive ratings as a place to shop and go for recreation opportunities.

However, there are obvious areas for improvement for Yellow Springs. While there is a perception within the community that Yellow Springs offers excellent educational opportunities, this perception is not apparent when surveying respondents living more than ten miles from the Village. Many respondents indicated that they knew little about Yellow Springs schools, and fewer know anything about Antioch College or Antioch McGregor. Therefore, marketing what Yellow Springs has to offer outside of Greene County might make respondents around the Miami Valley more aware of what is available. In an era in which news broadcasts focus only on public schools receiving perfect test scores and those in academic emergency, Yellow Springs must do more to reach out to the external community to promote its educational strengths.

In order to grow and maintain a functioning, vital community, it is important to attract young people who will stay in the community and raise a family. These young respondents (those under the age of 35) identify quality of schools and job opportunities as the two most important qualities when choosing where to purchase a home. Of concern to Yellow Springs is that the Village did not fare well in either of these categories, finishing well behind other Miami Valley communities.

One hypothesis of researchers was that Yellow Springs would compare very well among politically liberal individuals and persons of color. These hypotheses are not supported by survey data. While politically liberal individuals were more likely to choose Yellow Springs on several of the questions, the differences by political affiliation were not statistically significant. Similarly, in almost every instance, race was not a significant variable in determining whether an individual would visit Yellow Springs.

While attracting individuals to the community for shopping and recreation is important, improving other aspects of the community's image are crucial in order to attract people who want to live in the community.

It should be noted that this study measures external PERCEPTIONS of Yellow Springs, not the reality of what is going on within the Village. Yellow Springs has many strengths (e.g. high quality education from pre-K to adult, significant and diverse employment opportunities, a variety of housing choices) which are not widely recognized, but are highly correlated with desirability of a residential location. It would make sense to promote

existing attractive features of the community- at considerably less cost in time and money than competitor communities would need to expand and replicate them.

In conclusion, this survey serves as an important first step in identifying topics for the Village to address in the future. Subsequent research in the future will help explore whether steps taken by the Village are having the desired impact.
